

We don't have enough physicians to treat insured patronts 19th now. What happens when there are an estimated 30 million may be sured patients in 2014?
- The American Association of Medical Colleges estimates that by 2015, the shortage of doctors across all specialties will pradruple, to more than 60,000. By 2025, that number will reach a staggering 30,000. Last year there were 45,266 medical school applicants comoung for 19,517 seats. Thousands of qualified people every year can't get into medical school. This will be partly addressed by plans to open new medical schools and expand existing ones.

But there's a bigger problem. A regraduating from medical school, a newly minted doctor must complete a three-to-seven-year residency before practicing independently. These residency positions are largely federally funded, and while medical school enrollment has been slowly increasing, the number of residencies has been capped since the 1997 Balanced Budget Act.

A bill recently introduced in Congress would increase the number of residency training programs by 15,000 over five years. And while I applaud this proposal it's estimated that it will supply not even half of the physicians

necessary to address our shortage. We need to do more.
